Report on Review of Interim Condensed Consolidated Financial Information to the Board of Directors

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying interim condensed consolidated statement of financial position of Kuwait Syrian Holding Company - K.S.C.P. - Holding Company "the Parent Company" and its subsidiaries (collectively referred to as "the Group") as at 31 March 2016 and the related interim condensed consolidated statements of income, comprehensive income, changes in equity and cash flows for the three-month period then ended. The Parent Company's management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of this interim condensed consolidated financial information in accordance with International Accounting Standard No. (34) - "Interim Financial Reporting". Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on this interim condensed consolidated financial information based on our review.

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity."

A review of interim condensed consolidated financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim condensed consolidated financial information is not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with International Accounting Standard No. (34) - "Interim Financial Reporting".

Emphasis of Matter

- We draw attention to notes (4.3 & 12.2) of this interim condensed consolidated financial information regarding the acquisition of some assets from certain foreign subsidiaries before the disposal of such subsidiaries. The official procedures to transfer the ownership are in process during the subsequent period.
- We draw attention to note (13) of this interim condensed consolidated financial information regarding the effect of the political events and economic variables in the Syrian Arab Republic on the Group's business and its current and future financial position.

Our conclusion is not qualified in respect of these matters.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

Further, based on our review, the interim condensed consolidated financial information is in agreement with the books of the Parent Company. To the best of our knowledge and belief, no violations of the Companies Law No. 1 of 2016, or of the Parent Company's Memorandum and Articles of Association, as amended, have occurred during the three-month period ended 31 March 2016, except of owning properties held for trading by the Parent Company, that might have had a material effect on the business of the Group or on its consolidated financial position.

1. Incorporation of the Group

Kuwait Syrian Holding Company "the Parent Company" is a Kuwaiti Public Shareholding Company incorporated in 28 July 2002.

The main activities of the Parent Company are:

- Owning stocks in Kuwaiti or Non-Kuwaiti shareholding companies and shares in Kuwaiti or non-Kuwaiti limited liability companies and participating in the establishment, lending and managing of these companies and acting as a guarantor for these companies.
- Lending money to companies in which it owns shares, guaranteeing them with third parties where the holding company owns 20% or more of the capital of the borrowing company.
- Owning industrial rights such as patents, industrial trademarks, royalties, or any other related rights, and leasing to other companies to use it inside and outside state of Kuwait.
- Owning properties and moveable property to conduct its operations within the limits as stipulated by law.
- Utilizing the company's available surplus funds in financial portfolio managed by specialized entities.

The Parent Company's main office is at Rakan Tower, 16th Floor, Fahad Al-Salem Street, Kuwait.

These interim condensed consolidated financial Information comprise the financial information of the Parent Company and its subsidiaries (note 12), known collectively as "the Group".

On 1 February 2016, the new Companies Law no. 1/2016 was published in the Official Gazette which is effective from 26 November 2012. According to the new law, the companies law No. 25 of 2012 and its amendments have been cancelled however, its Executive Regulations will continue until a new set of Executive Regulations are issued.

These interim condensed consolidated financial information were authorized for issuance by the Board of Directors on 11 May 2016.

2. Basis of preparation

This interim condensed consolidated financial information has been prepared in accordance with International Accounting Standard No. (34), "Interim Financial Reporting".

The interim condensed consolidated financial information does not include all information and disclosures required for complete financial statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards.

In the management's opinion, all necessary adjustments, including recurring accruals have been included in the interim condensed consolidated financial information for fair presentation. The operating results for the period ended 31 March 2016 are not necessarily indicative of results that may be expected for the year ending 31 December 2016. For further information, it is possible to refer to the consolidated financial statements and its related notes for the year ended 31 December 2015.

The accounting policies used in preparing the interim condensed consolidated financial information similar to those used in the preparation of consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015 except for the adoption of the new and amended IFRS that have become effective and those which are applicable to the Group:

New and revised IFRSs issued and effective

In the current period, the Group has applied a number of new and revised IFRSs that are issued and effective:

- Amendments to IFRS 11 Accounting for Acquisitions of Interests in Joint Operations
- Amendments to IAS 16 & IAS 38 Clarification of Acceptable Methods of Depreciation & Amortisation
- Amendments to IAS 16 and IAS 41 Agriculture: Bearer Plants

The adoption of these standards did not have any material impact on the interim condensed consolidated financial information of the Group.

3. Fair value estimation

The fair values of financial assets and financial liabilities are determined as follows:

- Level one: Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level two: Quoted prices in an active market for similar instruments. Quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in market that are not active. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable.
- Level three: Inputs for the asset or liabilities that are not based on observable market data.

Procedures of obtaining licenses for certain lands are under process. The Parent Company management has decided to stop the development operations until the stability of the political situation in Syria (note 13).

- Investment properties of KD 1,255,090 as at 31 March 2016 (KD 1,257,347 as at 31 December 2015, KD 1,298,506 as at 31 March 2015) was mortgaged in favour of a bank in Syrian Arab Republic against credit facilities granted to one of the disposed subsidiaries and currently the Group are taking the necessary procedures to settle the situation.
- 4.5 Investment properties were evaluated based on the fair value as of 31 December 2015.

The financial information of the subsidiaries has been consolidated based on interim condensed financial information (unaudited) as at 31 March 2016.

Subsidiaries total assets amounted to KD 16,886,793 as at 31 March 2016 (KD 16,889,852 as at 31 December 2015, KD 16,502,142 as at 31 March 2015) and its profits amounted to KD 8,614 during the period ended 31 March 2016 (profit of KD 18,958 for the period ended 31 March 2015).

12.2 Disposal of subsidiaries:

During the prior years, the Group has sold its investments in the following subsidiaries with a consideration of KD 6,539,228:

- Syrian Al-Naser Gardens Company
- New Faihaa Shareholding Company
- Kuwait Syrian Company

Based on the sales agreement, all risks and rewards related to the ownership of the subsidiaries have been transferred to the buyer. The transfer of the ownership of shares in favour of the buyer are in the process during the subsequent period. Based on the above, the Group has ceased to consolidate the financial statements of such subsidiaries from the date of transferring the control to the buyer.

The Group offset between the amount due from the sale of subsidiaries of KD 6,539,228 and the amounts due to one of the disposed subsidiaries amounted to KD 6,468,100 based on the sales agreement, which states that offsetting of such amounts are permitted. Accordingly, the remaining balances due from the disposal subsidiary of KD 71,128 as at 31 March 2016 have been recognized under Trade and other receivables.

There are some economic and political events in the Syrian Arab Republic, which adversely affect the Group's business, where certain projects have been ceased and assets during the prior years were impaired due to the significant change in the Syrian currency against other currencies. It is difficult at this time to predict the effect of this economic and political events in the future. The Parent Company's management continuously study the impact of these variables on the assets' values and record any determined losses. The Parent Company's management is preparing the plans necessary to ensure its going on concern and monitoring control levels of performance and the recoverability of the assets. Also the Parent Company management study the available alternative to sale a part of the assets.

14. Dividends

On 23 March 2016, the shareholders approved the consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2015, and approved cash dividends of 3% from profits of 2015 (Nil - 2014), and Board of Directors' remuneration amounting to KD 45,000 for year 2015.
